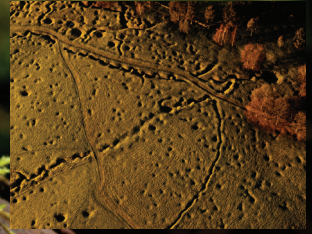
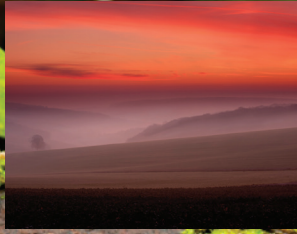

Exploring the themes of peace and reconciliation to mark the centenary of the Armistice, these stunning battlefield images from across the globe capture how the healing power of time and nature have created landscapes of beauty, peace and tranquillity where once there was devastation, suffering and loss.

The exhibition pays tribute to all those across the sixty nations that contributed to the war effort on all fronts, including Ashford, in what was the first truly global armed conflict.
